



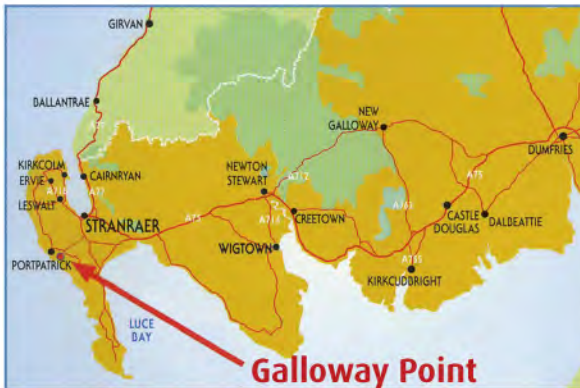
**CREAM OF GALLOWAY, Gatehouse of Fleet**

**Directions to Galloway Point:-**  
 From Dumfries on the A75, turn left on entering Stranraer at the crossroads, signposted Portpatrick A77. At T junction turn left on to Dalrymple Street. At roundabout at Lidl's supermarket, go straight over. Approximately 3 miles along this road, take turning on right signposted Portpatrick, Lochans A77. As you enter Portpatrick, take first turning on left and follow road up the hill. Galloway Point is on right at the top of the hill.  
 From Ayr on A77 as you enter Stranraer take the turning on the left before the Cragneider Hotel, at the railway bridge. At crossroads, go straight across. At T Junction turn left on to Dalrymple Street. Then continue as above.

**G**alloway Point Holiday Park is situated less than a mile from the popular and unspoilt coastal village of Portpatrick, in the Southwest corner of Scotland. Overlooking the Irish Sea, the Park enjoys panoramic views taking in the distant Mountains of Mourne.

Galloway Point is a quiet and peaceful site in which to relax. Our emphasis is on quality facilities and we have extensively refurbished areas of the park, while maintaining it's inherent natural beauty. The combination of a well appointed site with appealing scenery makes Galloway Point Holiday Park an attractive haven for visitors, particularly in Spring and early summer when the flora is in full bloom.



Gently undulating, covering 22 acres, Galloway Point Holiday Park offers its visitors peaceful surroundings. The touring season runs from March – October.

All pitches have electric hook up points. Electricity is included in the nightly tariff. A brand new log cabin housing the state of the art shower facilities, launderette and games room for the kids sits pride of place on the hill. Ramps up to this building provide excellent access routes in for those less abled.

Fully equipped Ladies, Gents and Disabled Rooms, which are only

accessible to the touring customers thanks to a secure locking system, are maintained to a very high standard. These are heated and have excellent hot showers, toilets and hairdryers.

In addition to these, there is an excellent disabled shower room with specialist disabled fittings. This houses a baby changing unit also. There is a separate dish washing area and launderette with automatic coin operated machines, dryers and ironing facilities for all to use. The games room and a new play park provide fun and entertainment for the whole family.

Whatever your pursuits, the countryside around Galloway Point can cater for all your needs. Dumfries and Galloway has a rich, historical heritage. The region's proximity to the English border has left a legacy of castles and fortifications which can be explored.

The area also has great significance in the establishment of Christianity in Scotland and there are many places of interest to visit, including the archaeological dig at Whithorn and St Nimians Cave.

Every sport you can think of can be catered for in the region with golfers having the luxury of the excellent links course at Dunskey on your doorstep. There are more than 23 golf courses in the area to test your skills. For the active visitor perhaps walking the 212 mile Southern Upland Way is an attraction, passing through some of the most varied and unspoilt countryside in Scotland.



#### PORTPATRICK

Portpatrick is one of the most picturesque ports in Scotland. The harbour is still the focal point of the village, sustaining a small fishing industry. It is therefore no surprise to learn that sea angling is a popular pastime with visitors. There is also the opportunity to try river and loch fishing inland.

The small sandy beach offers the visitor a comfortable place to relax and bathe, while the local craft industries appease those with discerning eyes for bargains. A children's playpark, tennis courts, a bowling green, putting green, horse riding, water skiing, a lifeboat museum and the 16th Century Dunskey Castle are among the local attractions.

During the summer a number of activities are arranged by the local community which are fun to attend and provide an insight into the local area - for example the "RNLI lifeboat week" in August and the "Folk Festival" in September.

#### GARDENS

The surrounding area is a gardeners dream. Since the climate is influenced by the Gulf Stream, there are several renowned gardens nearby. These include Castle Kennedy, Ardwell, Glenwhan and possibly the best known, Logan Botanical Gardens which exhibits many exotic trees and plants.

#### LOGAN BOTANICAL GARDENS

Described as a "touch of the exotic", this garden is home to the most spectacular collection of bizarre and unusual plants. Wander around the Walled Garden, Water and Terrace Garden and Woodland Garden and marvel at the blaze of colour which is present all year round. Cakes to die for in the Cafe.

#### CASTLE KENNEDY AND LOCHINCH GARDEN

Famous for it's variety and number of rhododendrums, azaleas and magnolias. Other features include a walled garden, monkey puzzle avenue and impressive two acre circular lily pond.

#### LOGAN FISH POND

Fully restored Victorian Fish Larder in a unique setting. Touch and feel the fish as they swim around the tidal pool.
